With your support, Roper St. Francis Cancer Care works tirelessly to wage war on cancer, engaging many resources along the way, including board-certified cancer specialists, evidence-based treatment plans, new technologies, groundbreaking clinical trials, a robust patient navigation program, and patient support through the Donna Fielding Cancer Wellness Institute.

Your support has allowed us to assist 57 patients with vital resources that alleviate the financial pressure of a cancer diagnosis and allow patients to focus on their treatment.

2018:

- 16 patients with gas cards
- 1 patient with rent
- 10 patients with overdue utility bills
- Groceries and meal cards

2019:

- 7 patients with rent or lodging
- 5 patients with gas cards
- 18 patients with overdue utility bills
- Groceries and meal cards

The men and women you've helped

- A young 24-year-old with metastatic cancer, traveling over 50 miles round trip for care, was supported with gas cards and meals tickets for his family. His family traveled with him due to special needs and limited child care resources.
- A gentleman who entered hospice was assisted with groceries and gas cards.
- A patient was supported with rent, utilities, gas cards, and comfort medications. This patient remained employed, but at a lower paying job, during some painful times. With donor support, we could avoid eviction for him, his wife, and teenage child.
- An elderly lady with advanced cancer, traveling over 50 miles for care, was assisted with lodging for her and her caregiver.
